This form is for PhD students who wish to supervise undergraduates in 2024-'25.

Please *first* discuss your intention to supervise undergraduates with your supervisor; they need to sign below confirming that they are happy for you to take on supervision work and that they support the paper(s) you have chosen to be listed for.

After you have your supervisor's agreement and confirmation, please email the Paper Coordinator(s) for your chosen paper(s). Introduce yourself and explain why you are interested in supervising on their paper. The Paper Coordinator may advise you to attend the meetings for supervisors arranged by each Paper Cordinator at the start of the academic year.

Current PhD students should choose a maximum of two papers to be listed as being available for, and should only accept students to supervise in a single paper (because of the preparation involved). You may consult with your supervisor, though, if the opportunity to supervise in two different papers arises and you feel is feasible to do so. If there are further papers you are open to supervising, you can still make your interest known to the paper coordinators, but please prioritize a maximum of two papers to be initially listed under in the roster of available supervisors the department publicizes.

We recommend that PhD students **new** to supervising start off with selecting SAN1 (the first-year undergraduate Social Anthropology paper) and perhaps one other paper at most (SAN papers are listed below).

The Department puts together a list of suitable prospective supervisors for each paper to assist Directors of Studies in the Colleges who are responsible for the appointment (and payment) of supervisors. The Department does this to support the College system of undergraduate supervision. Once prepared, the list of prospective supervisors is made available to Directors of Studies who may or may not use it, and can exercise their own discretion in contacting and appointing supervisors for their students – often this latter process only takes place at the end of the summer or even the start of Michaelmas Term. The list of UG supervisors is agreed by the Department at the end of the academic year preceeding.
