DISSERTATION - Part IIB students

Friday 23 October 2020

Deadline for submission of FORM2 <u>Title of Dissertation</u> giving the title and a brief outline of contents. It is important that your title says what the Dissertation is about and where the research will be done (unless it is library based) – see more on this below. Getting your title clear at this early stage will enable you to better embark on the writing of the dissertation. Completed forms for Social Anthropology dissertations should be emailed to Claudia Luna (<u>cl353@cam.ac.uk</u>), Undergraduate Administrator, Department of Social Anthropology.

Friday 29 January 2021

Deadline for submission of FORM3 <u>Change to a Dissertation Title</u> – you only need to submit this form if there has been a change in your dissertation title since handing in your Form 2 Title of Dissertation Form. If you have no changes to your title, the title you submitted on your Title of Dissertation Form will be used for approval by the Head of Department.

The title you submit for approval should be a clear, factual description of the content of your dissertation, including the place(s) it relates to. You may wish later to give your dissertation an additional fancy 'title' of one kind or another: a memorable line from one of your informants, a clever pun that sums up the central idea, etc, etc. This fancy title is NOT the official title of your dissertation, and not what the Head of Department needs to approve. You should discuss the matter in good time with both your dissertation supervisor and your Director Studies (both of whom will have to sign the form you submit), but essentially the form of the title should be something like: 'Ideological conflicts in a development project in rural Zimbabwe', or 'A study of internet based marriage arrangements among South Asians in the UK', or 'The effects of conversion to Pentecostal Christianity on gender relations among the XXX in Papua New Guinea'. The title should give some indication of the ethnographic area or location researched as well as the subject of the research. If your title is not approved by the Head of Department, you will be asked to submit a revised title during Lent Term.

12 noon - Final date to **submit** your electronic dissertation to Social Anthropology Dissertation Moodle Course Site: www.vle.cam.ac.uk/course/view.php?id=90751

Dissertations should be submitted accompanied by one cover sheet (separate to the dissertation document) containing the following:

- (a) a brief synopsis of the contents of the dissertation
- **(b)** a statement signed by you that it is your own original work, and that it does not contain material that has already been used to any substantial extent for a comparable purpose
- (c) a declaration signed by you of the word count of the dissertation
